

Ultimate Guide: Passing the 2026 Road Signs Test

1. The Shape Code: Know Your Geometry

- **Red Triangles = Warnings:** These alert you to potential hazards ahead (e.g., roundabouts, crossroads, or sharp bends).
- **Red Circles = Prohibitions:** These tell you what you **must not** do (e.g., "No Entry," "No Cycling," or "No Overtaking").
- **Blue Circles = Mandatory Instructions:** These tell you what you **must** do or show a route for specific users (e.g., "Turn Left Ahead" or "Cycle Path Only").
- **Rectangles = Information:** Blue is for motorways, Green is for primary A-roads, and White is for local roads.

2. 2026 High-Priority Signs

The 2026 exam has increased its focus on "Active Travel" and "Environment" signs. Pay close attention to:

- **Clean Air Zones (CAZ):** Look for the green cloud symbol. Driving a non-compliant vehicle here without paying can lead to heavy fines.
- **Segregated Cycle Tracks:** A blue sign with a pedestrian and a bicycle separated by a white line. This means you must stay on your designated side.
- **Smart Motorway Signals:** A **Red X** on a gantry is not a suggestion; it is a legal requirement to exit that lane immediately.

3. Common "Trick" Signs

- **The "No Vehicles" Sign:** A red circle with a white center (totally empty). This means all motor vehicles are prohibited.
- **Waiting vs. Loading:** A single yellow line on the road means "No Waiting." A yellow mark on the **kerb** means "No Loading."
- **The National Speed Limit:** A white circle with a black diagonal stripe. On a single carriageway, this is **60 mph**; on a dual carriageway or motorway, it is **70 mph**.

1. **Variable Speed Limits:** Unlike advisory yellow signs, a red ring around a number on a motorway is a **mandatory** limit. Speed cameras are calibrated to these exact numbers.
2. **T-Junction vs. No Through Road:** A red triangle with a 'T' is a warning of a junction. A blue square with a 'T' and a red top means the road is a dead end.
3. **Brown Signs:** These are purely for tourism. If you see a brown sign with a football, it's a stadium; a castle is a historic site.
